CELL PHONE COLLECTION PROGRAM

In August I shipped out 35 cell phones with a value of \$26.70. I received a check for \$24.80 and have asked he treasurer to split the money between the NEF and the Legacy Memorial Scholarship. We are owed two checks for the phones we have shipped out. One check is for \$50.05 and one for \$26.70. The amount we are paid has been fluctuating due to the economy but the value of high end phones has gone up from \$15 per phone to \$30 per phone. I receive a minimum of \$.45 per phone so the program is still making money for the two funds. We do not paid for shipping as the recycling company sends me prepaid shipping labels via UPS. Keep collecting cell phones and bring the cell phones to the county meeting or if you have a large amount I will come to you to get them. A large amount is 25 or more, make it worthwhile for me to drive to where ever you may be. I still pickup phones from the Town Hall for the Town of Hempstead and from Levittown Hall.

“HOMELAND SECURITY”

When disasters happen volunteers are needed to mobilize other local volunteers and resources. Disaster related volunteer work may include such tasks as damage assessment, food preparation, language interpretation and message delivery. Other tasks run the gamut from cleaning up to entering data to transporting people to answering phones. We are now in the hurricane season and Long Island is overdue to get hit with a bad one. We have had effects from Hurricane Bill and this weekend we will feel the effects from Hurricane Danny. Volunteers are needed the most when these type disasters hit.

Volunteer the use of the post building in emergency or disaster situations. Get member of the post to attend CERT (Community Emergency Response Teams) training. This training is 20 hours and they must attend all sessions. Local volunteers are necessary for the hardest and longest part of any terrorist attack, or natural disaster, the recovery phase. Local volunteer know how the area was before the attack or disaster and they know the best ways around any blockage of roads or other obstacles. Volunteers should only take on jobs or tasks that they are qualified to do, this way the risk of someone being hurt or worst is minimized.

Remember: “ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING”.

Due to a coding error approximately one third of the recipients should not have received the letter. ALS is a fatal disease and not everyone who received the letter has the disease. The VA is calling all the veterans who received the letter in error and is offering an apology.

PTSD may Get Easier to Establish

The VA is publishing new rules in the Federal Register to make it easier for veterans to claim PTSD. The new rules would not require corroboration of a stressor but would merely require a VA psychiatrist or psychologist to confirm that the stressful experience recalled by a veteran adequately supports a diagnosis of PTSD and that a veteran's symptoms are related to the claimed stressor. Comment on the proposed rule will be accepted over the next 60 days.
