“LEGISLATIVE REPORT”

The Legislative Report is very short this month. The National Commander has strongly protested the “Don’t Ask, Don’t Tell” court decision and he believes it should be settled by congress and not one court judge. He believes this would be an adverse effect on the troops in combat areas and has urged the President to get it settled thru congress.

CELL PHONE COLLECTION PROGRAM

The cell phone shipment for the month of November was 213 phones with a value of \$145.25. When the check comes in December I will split it between the NEF and the Legacy Memorial Scholarship program. I received 183 phones from the Oyster Bay Civic Association which they collected but then the recycling company went out of business. They called me and asked what I did with the phones I collected and when I detailed our program they give me the phones. If they collect any more they will forward them to me. In October and November we only collected only 30 phones thru the posts and from the Town of Hempstead. I need 50 phones to ship so bring them to the County Meeting or call me at (516) 922-7135 to arrange a time for me to pick them up, please have a large amount to make it worthwhile for me to drive to where ever you may be. Your other option is to drop them off at my home.

“HOMELAND SECURITY”

Each Post in the County should have a chairman for Homeland Security and Civil Preparedness and that name should also be forwarded to County Chairman and Department Headquarters. As of this date I have only four names from four posts.

Homeland Security is not only about Terrorism, it covers disasters such as, floods, hurricanes, train derailments, fire, snowstorms etc. The posts and CERT personnel can be a tremendous help in times of emergency. Hurricane season is not over and we are being hit with many storms of high winds and heavy rain. Tides have been extremely high in the coastal regions, which has been causing flooding. The cornerstone of preparedness and prevention is AWARENESS for all hazards. The skills, training and education that veterans have make your observations and involvement even more critical.

Terrorism has many formal definitions. In most it involves illegal activity, including use of force or violence directed against the civilian population. It is intended to coerce or intimidate a government or civilian populations or noncombatants in furtherance of terrorist political/social objectives. Terrorism can be domestic, international, state-sponsored or loosely affiliated. The government decision to hold off on the trail of the five terrorists does not mean we should let our guard down, we still have to be alert especially in the upcoming holiday season as this is a prime time for terrorists acts. The bottom line is “ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING”.

BOYS STATE PROGRAM

SUPPORT FOR TROOPS ON ACTIVE DUTY

There were 94 packages shipped since the first of November, I have another 23 boxes packed and will also pack approximate 25 more. Two schools collected Halloween candy, Commander Frank Colon had 18 boxes weighing approx. 450 lbs and Angelo Grande had 13 large boxes weighing approx 450 pounds. The 18 boxes from Frank Colon had to be repackages and the total number of boxes became 38 boxes. I try to use Priority Mail Flat Rate APO/FPO boxes and pay a rate of \$12.50 per box no matter where it is shipped to. The APO AE with zip code starting with 09 is less money then the APO/FPO AP with zip code starting with 96. But the flat rate APO/FPO is a standard of \$12.50 per box. I also received from the Plainview Post #1812 23 boxes of items that the Plainview Library collected. They also gave us two big garbage cans full of items which went to Ken Cadieux and they gave me about 200 Priority Mail Boxes for shipping. Plainview Post #1812 had a fund raiser and

collected \$400 which they donated to the Family Support Fund to help with shipping. We also received another 7 boxes of books from the North Shore Towers Library, the total is now 19 Boxes which I have turned over to Ken Cadieux. After the first of the year I will contact the individual at Camp Drum to adopt a troop as they will have another 10,000 plus departing for Afghanistan in late December or early January.

800 number in place for post IRS questions

An 800 phone number is available for American Legion posts to contact the Internal Revenue Service with questions regarding Employee Identification Numbers. Legion posts can call the IRS's Business and Specialty Tax Line at (800) 829-4933 from 7:00 a.m.–10:00 p.m. local time (Pacific Time for Alaska and Hawaii), Monday through Friday.

Hundreds of small American Legion posts and American Legion Auxiliary units stand to lose their tax-exempt status if they have not filed Form 990N with the Internal Revenue Service by Oct. 15 or have not filed any other 990s for three consecutive years, regardless of their annual revenues and expenses. Those entities that have not filed a 990 for a number of years may find that their Employer Identification Numbers (EIN) have been removed from the IRS system. In that case, according to American Legion National Judge Advocate Philip B. Onderdonk, posts are strongly urged to file a form SS-4 and apply for a reinstatement or new number.

Posts that lose their tax-exempt status can appeal to the Department of Treasury with a letter of justification for not obeying the law. The secretary of the Treasury has discretion to grant tax-exempt status. The filing requirement, previously unnecessary for entities with \$25,000 or less in annual revenue, is imposed as part of the Pension Protection Act of 2006.

A listing of American Legion entities at risk of losing tax-exempt status as of June 30, 2010, was posted by the IRS on the Web.

Start the new Legion year off by collecting and writing up your Post members contributions so your Post can make a selection during the month of January or February. The County deadline is MARCH 1st. 2011.

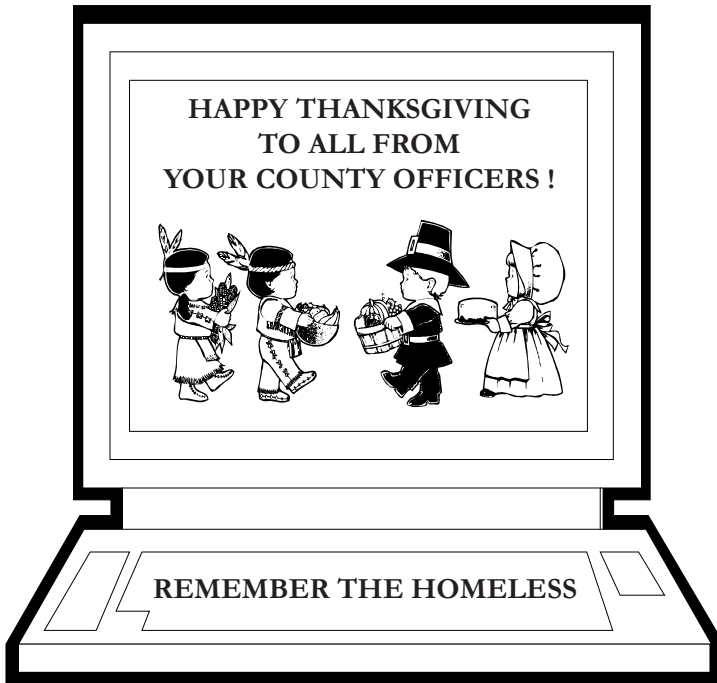
