“LEGISLATIVE REPORT”
REGINALD BUTT- CHAIRMAN

To start, I have received an appointment to the National Legislative Council for a two year term from 01/03/2011 to 01/03/2013. I have been assigned to work with Congresswoman Carolyn McCarthy office.

On February 14, Presidential Obama released his fiscal year 2012 federal budget proposal. The Legislative Division began analyzing the President’s budget. Overall the \$132 billion VA budget marks a 4 percent increase over the administration’s 2011 budget, which still has not been completed by Congress. Federal spending is currently being funded by continuing resolution (or CR, Public Law 111-322 which expires on 4 March), meaning that the Obama administration’s request for the VA is a 10 percent increase over 2010 levels.

There are some areas of the 2012 budget proposal which are commendable. The total medical care program would be funded at \$53.8 billion, exceeding the American Legion’s recommendation by \$4.3 billion. However there are major concerns, one are is VA construction projects that the department needs in order to serve the projected 6 million veterans who will use its facilities in the upcoming year. Further, Congress should immediately approve the \$208 million allotted to fund the veteran’s caregivers program, which has experienced delays in its implementation. The program was signed into law on May 5 of last year (P.L. 111-163) and the program was supposed to be implemented last month.

The discretionary portion of the VA budget will receive a thorough review by The American Legion.

MIAP - MISSING IN AMERICA PROGRAM

A new program to have the ashes of hundreds of deceased veterans that are still being stored in funeral homes as unclaimed since WW-1 to date.

The ashes will be collected and given a military burial at the National Cemeteries on Long Island.

An attempt will be made to contact the families involved but if no one is found the ashes will still be given a proper burial in one of the niches at L.I. National or Calverton.

This program is being run by our Treasurer Andy Booth. For further information contact him.

All arrangements for burial will be made by the L.I. Funeral Directors Assn at no cost to us.

“HOMELAND SECURITY”
REGINALD BUTT, JR. PCC CHAIRMAN

Each Post in the County should have a chairman for Homeland Security and Civil Preparedness. The County Chairman is being asked to compile a list of names of all the Post Chairmen in their respective County. This list will be forwarded to the District Chairman, who will compile the District list and then forward it to the Department Chairman. Each post should forward their chairman’s name to the County Chairman. Include with the name, phone number, address and e-mail address (if one is available)

Homeland Security is not only about Terrorism, it covers disasters such as, floods, hurricanes, train derailments, fire, snowstorms etc. The posts and CERT personnel can be a tremendous help in times of emergency. The cornerstone of preparedness and prevention is AWARENESS for all hazards. The skills, training and education that veterans have make your observations and involvement even more critical. We are now learning of more cases of home grown terrorism, such as the Times Square Car Bomb (which failed) and was reported by two individual who saw something and said something. These two individuals were veterans and both were Legionnaires. The Arizona shooting was an act of home grown terrorism but not tied to any terrorist group. A Saudi native was just arrested for plotting a terror bombing plan. You must be alert at all times and if you see something tell someone.

Terrorism has many formal definitions. In most it involves illegal activity, including use of force or violence directed against the civilian population. It is intended to coerce or intimidate a government or civilian populations or noncombatants in furtherance of terrorist political/social objectives. Terrorism can be domestic, international, state-sponsored or loosely affiliated.

The bottom line is “ALWAYS BE ALERT AND IF YOU SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING”.

CELL PHONE COLLECTION PROGRAM

I have a shipment of approximate 120 cell, phones ready to ship. The phones picked up tonight will be included in the shipment. I did not have any phones to ship in January or February as I need 50 phones to ship, this requirement is imposed by the Recycling Center as they pay the shipping costs. Keep collecting the cell phones and adapters, bring them to the County meeting or if you have a large amount call me to arrange a drop off or pick them up. Gas prices are going sky high so the traveling should be kept at a minimum.

SUPPORT FOR TROOPS ON ACTIVE DUTY

Packages being shipped in February and March include boxes of Valetine Cards man by the children of various schools (Levittown, North Bellmore, Wantagh) along with items collected by these schools. The items included socks, t-shirts, toiletry items and snack food. I added some magazines and soft covered books (less weight). The total count of boxes shipped will excess 40 boxes. The shipping takes 7 to 10 days and plus the time to package them. If any post would like to adopt a troop please con tact Mike Plum via e-mail at PLUMMIKE@aol.com.

I received two requests for assistance from individuals who contacted National American Legion which then passed it to the Department of New York and Barbara Kerr passed it on to me. I helped the one person with information and put her in contact with the US Volunteers to get a Firing Squad for her fathers funeral. The other request was forward to the Freeport Post to see if they could render assistance on getting a WWII vet to a doctors appointment in Plainview. The vet's son was going to be away during the time of the appointment. Commander Calvin Andrew took the information and was trying to contact the concerned party.

Burial in VA National Cemeteries

Burial in a VA national cemetery is available for eligible veterans, their spouses & dependents at no cost to the family & includes the gravesite, grave-liner, opening & closing of the grave, a headstone or marker, & perpetual care as part of a national shrine. For veterans, benefits also include a burial flag (with case for active duty) & military funeral honors. Family members & other loved ones of deceased veterans may request Presidential Memorial Certificates

Surviving spouses of veterans who died on or after Jan. 1, 2000, do not lose eligibility for burial in a national cemetery if they remarry. Burial of dependent children is limited to unmarried children under 21 years of age, or under 23 years of age if a full-time student at an approved educational institution. Unmarried adult children who become physically or mentally disabled and incapable of self-support before age 21, or age 23 if a full-time student, also are eligible for burial.

VA operates 125 national cemeteries, of which 65 are open for new casketed interments and 21 are open to accept only cremated remains. Burial options are limited to those available at a specific cemetery but may include in-ground casket, or interment of cremated remains in a columbarium, in ground or in a scatter garden. Contact the nearest national cemetery to determine if it is open for new burials and which options are available.
